AUSTRIAN FLEET ATTACKS THREE ITALIAN TOWNS

London, June 18.—Austrian naval vessels have bombarded three Italian towns on the Adriatic Sea, Rimini, Peasaro and Fano. Damage is reported to be slight.

Meanwhile, Austrian

troops continue to hold Tolmino with a force of some 30,000 troops. Italy seems determined to take it, thus opening their way into the Isonzo Valley.

Austrian artillery have been bombarding the Aus-

trians at St. Cassain, Monte Cristo and the Austrian positions around Monte Croce.

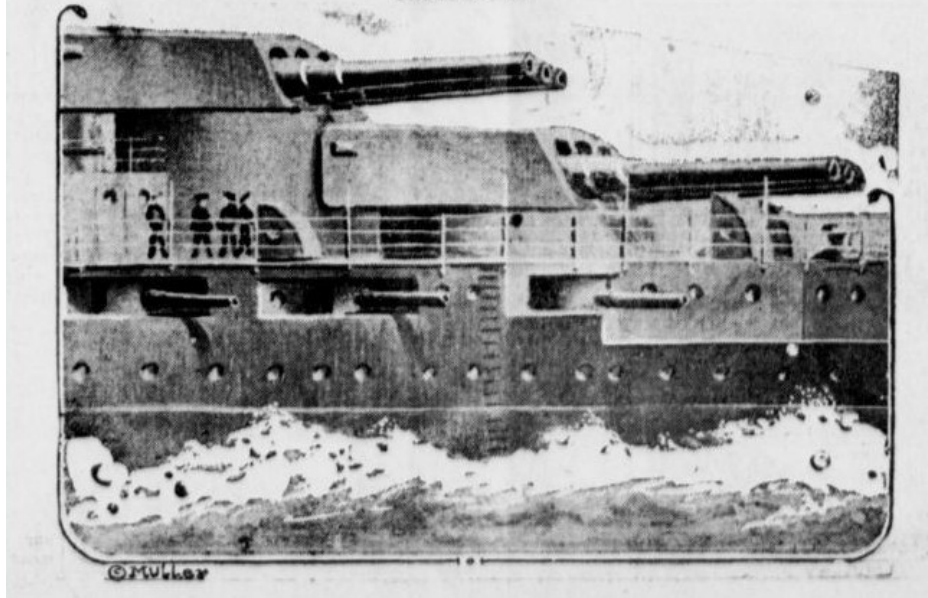
